

TCCA HPCA Student Travel Support

- 23 male / 8 female
- 20 US / 11 non-US
- Assignment through prioritization system
 - Higher weight for female/URM, then underrepresented school, then paper presentation at conference vs. workshop
 - Support varies from \$500 to \$700+
 - 4 female + 1 male students supported from schools w/o
 HPCA tradition and who are not presenting a paper

Joint SIGARCH/TCCA working group to study and reduce conference registration cost

Governance rules

- Goal: increase transparency and diversity
- TCCA Executive Committee
- Conference SC, GC, PC, keynotes, panels, etc.
 - Target all TCCA (co-)sponsored conferences
- Award committees

Example #1: HPCA (and ISCA) PCselection procedure

- TCCA Chair solicits candidates for Program Chair from EC
 - Make sure we have a diverse list (gender, institutional affiliation, geographic location, age)
- 2. If list is too long, the EC is asked to reduce the list (5 to 8 candidates)
- 3. EC members rank candidates
- 4. Overall ranking through condorcet voting
- 5. Invite top-down

Example #2: HPCA ToT Award Committee rules

- Committee is appointed by TCCA Chair in consultation with EC
- Members serve staggered 3-year terms
- Committee consists of 5 members at least 2 from TCCA EC; at least 2 at large; at least 2 to from industry
- TCCA Chair should strive for diversity along a number of axes: gender, institutional affiliation, geographic location, seniority





HPCA 2018 Program Chair's Report

Yuan Xie
University of California, Santa Barbara

Submission & Review Process

- 260 submissions: A record-high submission number in the last 12 years. 16% increase of the submissions compared to 2017.
- 54 PC members, 111 ERC members.
- 1325 reviews were received
 - for an average of 5.2 reviews/paper.
- Each paper has 5-6 reviews (with at least 3 PC reviews and 2 ERC reviews)
 - except some low quality papers which only 3 reviewers were assigned based on the initial screening.


Review Process

- Authors were given choices of traditional rebuttal or paper revision.
 - 129 rebuttals
 - 49 revisions
- 1.5 day TPC meeting@Boston (co-located with MICRO)
 - Thank Dave Kaeli for help!
 - 51 out of 54 attended the meeting in person
- 54/260 accepts
 - 20.7% acceptance rate




Historic Statistics



HPCA Business Meeting Discussion for the HPCA 2019 Review Process

PC Chairs: Viji Srinivasan and Rajeev Balasubramonian

Dates:

- Submission deadline: August 3rd 2018
- Rebuttals/revisions: October 4-18
- Notification: November 5th
- MICRO'18 is Oct 20-24 and MICRO'18 notification is mid-July

Non-Controversial Policies

- Reminder of implicit biases before reviewing begins
- Adding a word count limit to submission guidelines
- PC will write a post-discussion summary for every paper
- Authors can submit a revised pdf during the rebuttal phase
- 2-phase review process
 - All papers get 4 reviews (2 PC, 2 ERC) in round 1
 - About 110 papers get one more PC review in round 2
 - Reduces PC load to 10+2 (important!)

Thanks to many earlier PC Chairs for suggestions and for introducing some of these practices.

Policies Worth Debating I

- PC will be given guidance about a suggested distribution of merit scores
 - For example, 4-5 scores of weak-accept-orbetter among a PC member's 12 papers
- PC and ERC will assign ranks to papers
 - The ranks will be used for calibration and may influence discussion order at the PC meeting
- Empirical data: MICRO'17 had 41%/37% positive reviews

Policies Worth Debating II

- Optional suggestion to reviewers:
 For re-submitted papers, authors have the option of submitting a second pdf with all the changes highlighted.
- This second pdf will not be visible to reviewers by default
- If a reviewer has previously reviewed the paper, they can request the second pdf from the PC Chairs
- Why?
 - Reduces load for reviewers; improves review quality
 - Forces authors to seriously consider feedback
 - Creating a second pdf should be trivial for authors

Policies Worth Debating III

- Current IEEE/ACM policy:
 - On-line pre-prints are allowed, e.g., arxiv, tech-reports
- Informal guideline to reviewers:
 - On-line pre-prints are not viewed as prior work
- There are some good reasons to post pre-prints; please weigh these against the significant downside that you are disrupting the double-blind review process
- In most cases, short papers in CAL and workshops may be preferred as an early checkpoint

Local Travel

Travel to Edinburgh

Edinburgh boasts an international airport with flights from North America and many European and UK destinations. Taxi, tram and bus links connect the airport to the city centre with a journey time of 25-30 minutes.

Rail

Edinburgh stations are linked to all the UK's major cities and airports. A high-speed link from London takes just over four hours.

Taxis

Fares vary according to the time of day and traffic, but a typical fare from the airport to the School would be £25 with a journey time of 25-30 minutes.

Lothian Buses run many routes from across the city to the central campus. A single ticket costs £1.60 and a day ticket is £4.00.
